Mr. Anilkumar an Engineering graduate in Electronics and Communication from Karnataka University. He also has a Postgraduate Diploma in International Masters in practicing Management from INSEAD France and IIM Bangalore. He has an industrial experience of more than 19 years and has worked with well-known companies like MAX India Ltd, Trans Marketing Pvt Ltd before co-founding the company. He has an all-round experience in various areas like R&D, Manufacturing, Marketing and Turnkey projects. He is a well-known consultant in PCB industry and currently is the President of Indian Printed Circuits Association. He has good rapport with International associations like IPC (USA), JPCA (Japan), TPCA (Taiwan), CPCA (China) and EPCA (Europe). He has also represented India at World Electronics Circuits Council at Japan in 1999.

He interacted with the start-ups and shared his journey as an entrepreneur and the challenges that he faced during his course of it. He discussed at length about product development and how do you get the product to the market and sustain the product in the market. The strength of the company lies in the ability to respond quickly to customers, create new markets, rapidly develop new products, and dominate emergent technologies. The key to this process is personal commitment, the employees' sense of identity with the enterprise and its mission.

### Session Opportunities & Strategies for a Digital Era by Mr. Ashok Soota, Co-Founder Happiest Minds Technologies:

Attended by about 450 students, start-ups and academicians

Mr. Ashok is a leader of industry. Prior to founding Happiest Minds in August 2011, Ashok led the growth of Wipro's IT business from US\$ 2 million to US\$ 500 million run-rate. Subsequently, he was founding Chairman& MD of Mindtree and led it through a very successful IPO. His second entrepreneurial venture, Happiest Minds has already established several benchmarks in the IT Services industry in India and is on course to achieve its goal of being the fastest to achieve US\$ 100 million revenue. He was President of Confederation of Indian Industry (CII), India's largest Industry association and also President of Manufacturers' Association of Information Technology. He has served on the Prime

Minister's Task Force for IT and on the Advisory Council for the World Intellectual Property Organization, Geneva. For his contributions to India's IT industry, he has been recognized twice as IT Man of the Year, also as Electronics Man of the Year, and recognized at Infocom 2013, Kolkata, as one of the 12 Gems who helped to build Indian IT Industry. The companies he has led have created about 25,000 jobs during his leadership tenure.

He spoke about how the Digital Era has bought about a revolution in how businesses look at marketing the digital way. He spoke about how the digital era has opened previously unexplored avenues of opportunities and he also shed light on the strategies of digital marketing in order to make the best use of it. He shared tips on hot and trending topics such as Data Democratization, chat-bots redefining BFSI engagement, and Data Analytics.

This workshop was followed by one on one mentoring session completely focused on early stage startups. The Session was highly appreciated and received good feedback by the attendees.

We are really proud to inform you that 5 startups from KLE-CTIE have been selected to pitch at the Final Round of Elevate 100 on 29<sup>th</sup> & 30<sup>th</sup> August 2017 at Bangalore. 260 startups/teams were shortlisted across the state and were pitched their ideas in the finals. Proud moment for KLE-CTIE is 3 startups were part of 100 winners across the state. Department of Information Technology and Biotechnology, Government of Karnataka will announce the funding amount at the earliest as it's in the process.

#### Details of the Startups won the Elevate 100 Startup Contest

#### 1) Skykrafts Aerospace Pvt. Ltd

Skykrafts Aerospace Pvt. Ltd. is into building smart drones for agriculture, emergency logistics and rescue; it also builds drones for scientific research. It also builds drone software applications.

#### 2) Magveh Energy Recovery Systems Pvt. Ltd.

Magveh Energy Recovery Systems Pvt. Ltd. is currently working on a technology which can harness energy from suspension system of ground vehicles (buses, trucks, cars, trains etc.). This energy can be used to power the automobile systems and increase its overall efficiency.

#### 3) Snaptrude

Snaptrude is intelligence enabled rapid Modeling Platform for real estate. With Snaptrude, Architects and design teams would be able to save days' worth of effort in the manual design process and can make data driven decision using BIM approach. Snaptrude solves the design problem by automating digital designing with its patent pending intelligence enabled modeling and design platform which incorporates Building Information Modeling (BIM) approach from the concept design stage.

- 5. Very good initiative and platform where everyone can share their problems and challenges.



PUPA 2017 saw over 280 products being made, demonstrated and sold by students from High school, Commerce, Medical and Engineering streams. Having attracted participants from multidisciplinary streams; PUPA has helped budding entrepreneurs hone their technical, marketing and entrepreneurial skills.

Out of the students that attended this exchange about 15 students have gone on to have a successful business enterprise of their own.

## FEBRUARY 2018

#### Intel Ideation Camp

Date: 14/2/18 & 15/2/18 Organized by: Make In BVB (MIB)

Participated by 72 students

The Ideation of Ideas started with collective effort of Team MIB led by the director of CTIE, Mr. Nitin Kulkarni. From around 170 applicants, 70 of them were scrutinized and selected based on their skills in expressing themselves on the paper.





The event started with curious chapters on all the faces of participants of what's going to happen in the next two days. This was overtaken with the enthusiasm by some inspirational videos which set the participants on the right mindset of what is expected from them.

A set of three different topics were given based on their need in today's world and their effect on our surroundings. They were Smart city, Indian Agriculture and Cyber Security. The participants were asked first conduct a literary survey of the topic given and understand its stand in today's world. Form the data acquired, observe the lacking aspects and look for the stakeholders involved. After a complete assessment, form a problem statement to which you intend to solve with your creativity. The number of solutions for the problem was obtained and from them a single solution was realized. The basic aspects of business pitching were made aware to the participants like the Business Canvas Model and ways to present the solution along with marketing strategy.

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#### **Design Thinking Workshop**

Date: 18/2/18 Venue: R.H.Kulkarni building, LHC Senate Hall Number of participants: 20 The workshop on design thinking was organized with the aim of making the participants think from multiple angles and understanding the needs & expectations of multiple stakeholders while designing a product. The workshop was conducted for employees and employers of all startups incubated in KLE-CTIE.

#### What is Design Thinking?

Design Thinking is essentially a problem-solving approach, crystalized in the field of design, which combines a user-centered perspective with rational and analytical research with the goal of creating innovative solutions.

*Design Thinking* is essentially a problem-solving approach specific to design, which involves assessing known aspects of a problem and identifying the more ambiguous or peripheral factors that contribute to the conditions of a problem. This contrasts with a more scientific approach where the concrete and known aspects are tested in order to arrive at a solution. Design Thinking is an iterative process in which knowledge is constantly being questioned and acquired so it can help us redefine a problem in an attempt to identify alternative strategies and solutions that might not be instantly apparent with our initial level of understanding.

*Design Thinking* is often referred to as 'outside the box thinking', as designers are attempting to develop new ways of thinking that do not abide by the dominant or more common problem-solving methods – just like artists do. At the heart of Design Thinking is the intention to improve products by analyzing how users interact with products and investigating the conditions in which they operate. Design Thinking offers us a means of digging that bit deeper to uncover ways of improving user experiences.

The workshop was conducted by Mr. Rajeev Mankar, he has his roots in Dharwad. He has 22 years of Industry experience. Currently, he is the Product Manager at Veritas Software. He contributes in designing and strategizing the various services products offerings for the entire Services product portfolio. He completed his M.S. in Computer Science from Manipal University. He has a PGDBA from Emeritus Institute of Management SIngapore (In collaboration with MIT Sloan, Columbia and Tuck University). In free time plays Tennis and loves trekking and music.

#### Highlights of the day:

The workshop highlighted a lot on the important aspects of conceptualization, market feasibility, design and development, prototyping, and successful deployment of a product (or service). Towards the conclusion of the workshop, an internet based activity was organized. The eighteen participants had to enter innovative ideas into an internet tool called The Darwinator. The tool would let other participants' rate the ideas entered on a scale of 1 to 10. Top three ideas were shortlisted and the owner of those ideas would be free to select his/her team from the rest of the participants. The top three ideas were presented and were reviewed by Mr. Rajeev and the rest of the teams.

Few of the participants have given their feedback as follows:

Today's Workshop on design thinking was amazing. Got to understand lot of good things about design thinking. Please let us know when workshops like this happens in future I am very much interested to attend.




