LASER PULSE Researcher Registration

The LASER PULSE consortium funded by the USAID convenes and catalyzes a global network of Universities, government agencies, non-governmental organizations, and the private sector for research-driven, practical solutions to critical development challenges in low and middle income countries (LMIC).

<u>Note</u>: Only applicants from the LASER PULSE Higher Education Institution Network (HEIN) are eligible to register as researchers on this network.

Expectation:

By seeking to register as a LASER PULSE HEIN researcher, applicants are:

- expressing strong interest in using their research expertise to tackle critical challenges for development in LMIC(low and middle income countries), and
- committing to exploring opportunities and responding to opportunities that LASER PULSE may reach out to them for, and
- committing to their strong interest in working with partners outside their Institution such as Non-Governmental Organizations (NGO's), local governments or private sector to ensure that research results are translated to impact in practice, policy, or products that have a significant impact on critical development challenges.

Benefits:

- Registered researchers are eligible to apply for research grants in response to Requests for Applications (RFAs) issued by LASER PULSE starting some time in 2019.
- Registered researcher's expertise will be made available to USAID should future opportunities arise to engage their expertise.

Process:

All interested in registering as a LASER PULSE HEIN researcher must fill out this Qualtrics registration form. The form takes approximately 20 minutes to fill out. Once you fill out the form, we will inform you within one month if your application has been accepted or not

You need the following to start the registration process:

- 1. Your personal profile along with your website URL
- 2. Describe in 100 words your research expertise and how it could be used to effect policy or practice in sustainable development in LMIC
- 3. Three publications or reports which demonstrate your research and applications to global sustainable development.
- 4. List a maximum of 3 projects you have worked on that were financed by USAID, World Bank, UN, or other development donors (Project description in 100 words)
